'Hall of Flags' Among College Events to Honor U.S. Constitution

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An educational display of American flags, tracing the progression from mere banner to majestic national symbol, is among the Constitution Week events scheduled at Pennsylvania College of Technology from Sept. 15-19.

The historical "Hall of Flags" will be presented by members of the Benevolent and Protective Order of Elks, Lodge 1057, Jersey Shore, from 4 to 6 p.m. Constitution Day – Wednesday, Sept. 17, the 221st anniversary of our nation's founding document – in the college's Madigan Library. Light refreshments will be served.
